- The **country** I live in is called England.
- I live in or near Cinderford, which is a town in England.

What is the difference between a town and the countryside?

- Towns are places where people live and work.
- Towns are busier than the countryside.
- The countryside is land that is not in towns or cities.
- Most villages can be found in the countryside, often surrounded by farmland.

What is the UK?

- There are four countries in the United Kingdom (UK): England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
- Each of these countries has a capital city and a flag.
- The UK is an island—it is surrounded by seas: the Irish Sea, the North Sea and the **English Channel**

What are the four countries of the UK and their capital cities?
