On 17th October we sent two teams to the Forest of Dean Hockey tournament at Newent School. After a close competition our teams played each other in the semi-final and then finished in first and third places!



A team from Year 3 & 4 had a great tournament at Forest High and played well – they came third overall and drew with the eventual winners! Well done team!



The first football tournament of the year was on 29th September and we had so many children wanting to represent St White's we were lucky enough to enter two teams. The Lions finished joint top of the group. The Tigers also finished second in their group, both teams only conceded one goal in the tournament and both displayed excellent sportsmanship!



On 4th October we sent a team to the first event of the School Games which was Cross Country at Five Acres. There were 150 runners in total – our team showed great determination to finish second for both boys and girls as a team. In the girls race we had 3 runners in the top 10, the boys had two in the top 5! Well done to both teams for winning our first ever medals in cross country!
