Building strong foundations

- Jesus' incarnation is 'good news' for all people. 'Gospel' means 'good news'.
- The good news Jesus has spread after his incarnation (coming back to life) and how Christians decide to live their lives from his teachings.
- Those who follow what Jesus said have built firm foundations. This can mean trusting God, praying humbly, giving generously, forgiving and accepting forgiveness, loving yourself and neighbour.

Shows compassion: Jesus responds to the Centurion's request with kindness and is willing to help, even though the Centurion isn't one of the Jewish people.

Heals with authority: Jesus demonstrates that He has the power to heal, even from a distance, simply by speaking the word.

Values faith: Jesus praises the Centurion's faith, showing that belief in Jesus' power to heal is important.

Brings hope: By healing the servant, Jesus shows that God's power can bring healing and restoration to anyone who believes, regardless of their background.

Christians see that Jesus' teachings and examples are different to expectations - The Sermon on the Mount is an example of this, where Jesus' values go towards the weak and vulnerable.

4 main components of prayer:

Praise: Saying good things about God (e.g., "God, you are amazing because you made the world").

Confession: Admitting when we've done something wrong (e.g., "I'm sorry for being unkind"). Asking: Requesting help for ourselves or others (e.g., "Please help my friend who is sick").

Thanksgiving: Saying thank you to God (e.g., "Thank you for my family").
