Reception	<p>Portraits – painting and collage</p> <p>As they are learning all about themselves, children will learn all about portraits and self-portraits. Through looking at self-portraits by famous artists, children will begin to talk about what they like and don't like. They will have lots of opportunities to create using a range of materials both individually and working collaboratively.</p>	<p>Handa's Surprise – colour, pattern and texture</p> <p>Linking to the book Handa's Surprise, children will consider colour, pattern and texture through painting and collaging fruit and animals. Children will get the chance to try weaving as a way of creating pattern. They will work collaboratively and develop their sense of space in creating class collages.</p>	<p>At the beach - Claude Monet</p> <p>As the children learn about the seaside, they will study famous art and artists including Lowry and Monet. They will experiment with creating their art work in different media including printing and drawing. The children will be given an opportunity to look back at the art work they have completed over the year and share it with their friends.</p>
Year 1 and 2	<p>Printing – Pop Art</p> <p>Children will learn about Andy Warhol and the Pop Art movement. Inspired by this, they will learn more about printing and use this to create repeating pattern prints.</p>	<p>Painting – Wassily Kandinsky</p> <p>Throughout this unit of work children will have the opportunity to develop their skills in colour. They will study the work of artist Wassily Kandinsky and they will recreate his style of work using paint.</p>	<p>Sculpture – Michelle Reader</p> <p>Children will build on their sculpture skills looking at form and texture. They will use recycled materials to create sculptures inspired by Michelle Reader and following their sketchbook designs.</p>
Year 3 and 4	<p>Painting – Yayoi Kusama</p> <p>Children will develop their understanding of colour through looking at the work of a number of artists. This will inspire their harvest art work for the Autumn Art Exhibition.</p>	<p>Sketching – Georgia O'Keeffe</p> <p>Children will develop their sketching skills, including in using charcoal, to investigate the work of Georgia O'Keeffe. This will inspire them in creating sketches based on still life and observations.</p>	<p>Sculpture – Peter Randall Page</p> <p>Children will learn about Peter Randall Page and his sculptures which are inspired by nature. They will design and create their own clay sculpture using a range of sculpting techniques.</p>
Year 5 and 6	<p>Photography – Karl Blossfeldt</p> <p>Building on their work on photography in computing, the children will learn all about how to use space in both landscapes and close up photos. They will study the work of Karl Blossfeldt in creating close up images of plants and living things. This will inspire their harvest photography for the Autumn Art Exhibition.</p>	<p>Graffiti - Banksy</p> <p>Children will investigate how people use art to get messages across including exploring graffiti and the work of Banksy and other artists. They will use this learning to inspire a class mural, developing their skills in working cooperatively.</p>	<p>Drawing – Architecture</p> <p>Linking to their work in RE on different places of worship, the children will look at religious buildings from around the world. They will develop their work in their sketchbooks to take inspiration from them and use this to create their own design.</p>
