### Technical vocabulary

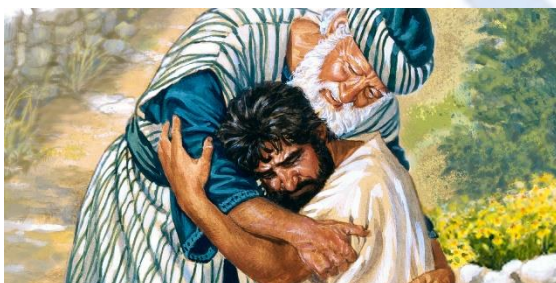
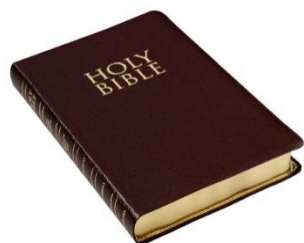
<b>Christian</b>	Someone who follows Christianity and worships God
<b>Church</b>	The sacred building for Christians
<b>Jesus</b>	The Son of God, a key figure in Christianity and the Bible
<b>Parable</b>	A story told to illustrate a moral lesson, often told by Jesus to his disciples
<b>Forgiveness</b>	The act of stopping to feel angry or sad towards someone else for their misdeed
<b>Prayer</b>	An expression of love or thanks to a religious deity, for Christians to God
<b>Worship</b>	The feeling and expression of love for a deity, for Christians for God
<b>Bible</b>	Christian scripture, containing the New and Old Testament

### Key Knowledge

- The Christian sacred text is the Bible. The Bible contains several stories (including parables) about the nature of God as well as how Christians should live their lives
- A parable is a story told to illustrate a moral lesson
- The Bible contains several parables, including that of the Lost Son
- Forgiveness is the act of stopping to feel angry for an action or towards a person; God is forgiving
- Christians pray for 4 slightly different reasons (pray, repent, ask, yield)
- Christians worship God in several ways, such as through prayer, telling stories, singing songs and reading the Bible

### The Parable of the Lost Son

- The parable of the Lost Son is from the Christian gospels – stories with a moral meaning, as told by Jesus to his followers.
- A farmer who has two sons divides his wealth. One son stays to work on the family farm, the other leaves the family home and returns years later, penniless. The Lost Son is treated as a returning hero, much to the annoyance of the son who stayed to work.
- This parable tells Christians how God is loving and forgiving
